• EN had met with to the Brahan memory trees. He said that the family have tried to find paperwork on who gifted the trees but they haven't been able to find anything.

He said that there are 22 metres of shelving held in the National Records of Scotland which may have information but it would take quite some time to go through!!! He did say that he had been told by that the majority of the oak planted on the Estate were planted in 1810 to address a Royal Navy shortage of wood. The Cabinet stayed on the Estate in 1922 when they were meeting in Inverness Town House to discuss the 'Irish Crisis'. Winston Churchhill and Lloyd George may have gifted a tree! However, said that he would be happy to jot down some information which may be useful for us.

All agreed in principle to everything proposed. It was noted that the style/design and location of the perch seats should discourage antisocial use and viewed photos of what they would look like. They appear to be rather uncomfortable for extended sits and would be along the main path, so use would be rather visible, hopefully they won't generate any problems.</li> <li>Next steps are to finalise any details on the style and design of sign. SF is to prepare blank templates showing required minimum dimensions of signs and we are all to fill in what we think would look good, at the next meeting we can discuss and develop our design for all our different signs so they can go to Scottish Forestry for approval. MP informed the group that OATs (outdoor access trust for Scotland) had been contacted and they will offer some advice and/or support to help us with our path works.</li> </ul>	SF to send out some blank templates with the sign dimensions.
